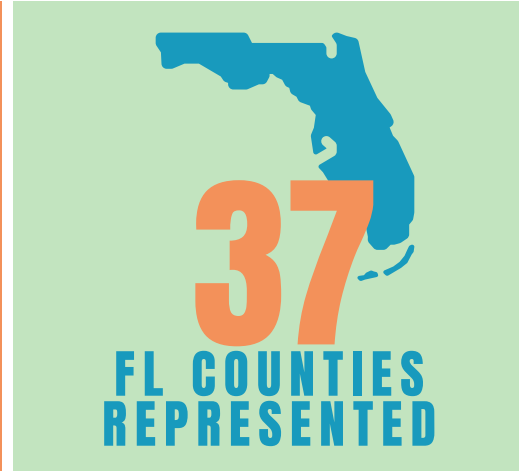

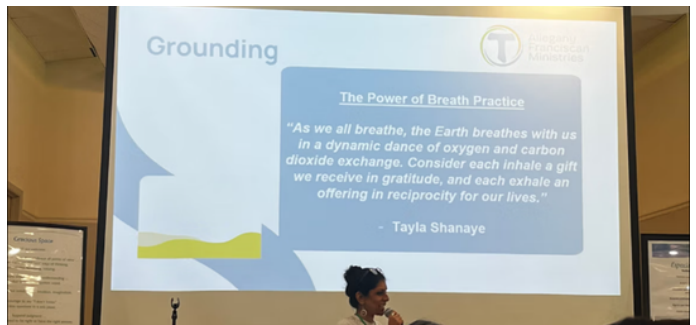
This convening was a direct response to feedback from grant partners, who expressed a desire for opportunities to connect and build relationships in person.

OUR COMMITMENT

Based on what we heard from you—through conversations, the convening, and the post-event survey—we're excited to build on this momentum together throughout the rest of 2026. Here's what's ahead:

Relationship Building

Director, Jeanette Ruiz, will embark on a statewide listening tour, meeting with partners in communities across Florida to strengthen relationships, deepen conversations, and continue building on the ideas and connections that emerged during the convening.



Supporting Civic Engagement

Many of you shared the importance of strengthening civic participation and Get-Out-The-Vote (GOTV) efforts. In response, we're offering civic engagement grants up to \$5,000 to support current or former grant partners already engaged in this critical work, helping communities prepare for and respond to emerging opportunities.



Continuing Allegany's Investment

Our commitment to this work remains strong. Early next year, Allegany Franciscan Ministries will announce its FY27 grant opportunities (including funding priorities) and potential convenings. We look forward to continuing to invest in the leadership, partnerships, and community-driven solutions that are creating lasting change across Florida.
